An Australian mission opportunity

We are looking for a “mum and dad” with a heart for mission among Indigenous young people. There are opportunities to work and live with these teenagers in the Top End. Our family group homes provide round the clock care for Indigenous young people from remote communities attending secondary school at Woolaning Homeland Christian College.

Family group homes are the backbone of providing these young people with education not available in their home communities. They live in homes in Woolaning with full time house parents who teach them to take on significant responsibilities as members of a family group. Cleaning, cooking, washing, shopping, church, sport and youth groups are all part of a total educational experience to equip each one to live a fulfilling life while in our family group homes and in their home communities.

Life at Woolaning is unique. The College is situated in a remote location 75km west of Batchelor on the boundary of Litchfield National Park. The College is placed there deliberately to provide a secure educational opportunity with minimal distractions.
