

# 1<sup>st</sup> Study Time

1<sup>st</sup> study is between 4:20 – 5:50

Every student on the College must attend. This is SACRED TIME and you must be prepared for study time before it starts. Students should be mindful of others and show respect by being very quiet. There are some rules.

- You must do homework, or study, or read.
- You may study on the bed, at the desk or on the floor, as long as you are doing your work or reading quietly.
- NO music.
- NO wandering around. Wandering is disruptive and causes stress to staff.
- You may fill out a “STUDY NOTE”. A supervisor (usually in the rec room) will have a ‘study note’ form. This allows you to apply for ‘group study’ in other rooms. This is useful if you need help with some subjects or you are working on projects.
- Remember – be prepared. Get a drink, get your stationery etc in order.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Study Time

2nd study is between 7:20 – 8:15 or 8:30

Every student on the College must attend. This is also SACRED TIME and you must be prepared for study time before it starts. Students should be mindful of others but you can do other things as well!. There are some rules.

- You may do homework, or study, or read, or you can even listen to music quietly.
- You will have to stay in your room unless you have been approved with a “STUDY NOTE”.
- NO wandering around. Wandering is disruptive and causes stress to staff. Wherever you have committed yourself to you must stay.
- Students must be involved in something academic or constructive. This could include quietly playing chess or scrabble, watching a documentary in the rec room or multi study room, etc.
- Be prepared – get some appropriate DVDs from the library or DVD shop.
- You may study with another person but this must be approved by a Supervisor. Remember – don't appear to be wandering as that is a really BAD thing!
- This is quiet time and the College should be 'still' and peaceful.

# REMEMBER

- **Be prepared.**
- **The College should be quiet and peaceful during both study times.**
- **Please don't tease staff by making silly requests or trying to 'bend' the study guidelines.**
- **Wandering, rudeness, and inconsiderate behaviour will result in staff getting cranky and you may lose privileges or get extra jobs to do.**

**(You can still volunteer to do extra jobs if you want to!)**
